## NCAIS: 1970 - 2020

2019-2020 marks 50 years of NCAIS, and what an exciting 50 years it has been! From our humble beginnings as a volunteer-led association that organized 2 events a year to a dynamic team of 4 employees, NCAIS now provides a plethora of programs, services, collaboration opportunities and support for our 87 member schools. We owe a great deal to Gordon Bingham, the first full-time Executive Director of NCAIS and his wife Cindy (deceased) who legitimized operations and established the foundation from which NCAIS has flourished. From Quail Roost to Southern Pines, gatherings that enable us to connect, learn, and grow together have been our hallmark. And, while this year of COVID has required creativity and adaptations, we still value and deliver those opportunities, albeit virtually. The pandemic's forced isolation and uncertainty has actually etched in our souls this fundamental need. So, as we prepare to enter our 51st year, we find ourselves still embracing what was recognized by our forefathers so many years ago: we truly are and will continue to be "better together."

## STRATEGIC PLANNING UPDATE

Strategic planning was a top priority for the NCAIS Board in 2019-2020. Working with strategic planning consultant Jamie Baker, the board launched a year-long intensive strategic planning initiative at a half-day retreat in late August 2019. Strategic planning was incorporated into quarterly board meetings in the fall of 2019 and winter of 2020. Executive Director, Linda Nelson, embarked on a state-wide listening tour, visiting more than 50 NCAIS schools before efforts were abruptly halted by COVID in early March. While the disruption to school as we know it and resulting changes coming from the pandemic may alter initiatives and priorities to some degree, the six months spent in strategic planning resulted in a new, more inclusive and personalized mission along with core values that will guide our efforts well into the future.

### **PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT**


A significant portion of NCAIS's revenue is generated through professional development offerings. As a core commitment, we strive to offer leading edge opportunities with our workshops and conferences. During the 2019-2020 school year, NCAIS offered 26 events, a combination of one-day and multi-day platforms, with 1,725 participants. 85 NCAIS schools and 11 guest organizations attending events during the year.

### **LEGISLATIVE UPDATE**

The NCAIS legislative agenda continued to grow in 2019-2020 as the educational landscape in our state became more complex. Organizations on both sides of the school choice movement worked throughout the year to further their respective interests, forcing the debate center stage in both the legislature and the news. NCAIS, along with other private school organizations, was called on to support and help shape legislation. Adding to the agenda and engagement, was the need for COVID-related legislation in the Spring of 2020 to protect schools from unwarranted legal liability and provide waivers for statemandated standardized testing. NCAIS was pleased with the legislature's responsiveness and support of these and other independent school issues and is grateful for the continued counsel and guidance of NCAIS lobbyists, David Horne and Joshua Grant, both with Smith Anderson in Raleigh, NC.
